- Actual enrollment was greater than all three projection models, ranging from 1.3% to 2.6% greater (+57 to +111 students).
- Low projection model performed best for elementary, including kindergarten (within 2 students, while medium performed best for middle school, and high model performed best for high school.
- For the medium model, greatest deviation was in Kindergarten (-13), 11th grade (+28), and 12th grade (+39).
- Differences in high school especially, 11th and 12th grades are due to the inclusion of students in Ridgefield Transition Program (RTP) and Ridgefield's outplaced students to better align high school persistency ratios with official state data to improve projections.





K-5 Individual School Projections Comparison

- Only K (-13) and 2nd (-10) grade deviated by more than ten students. With 1st and 3rd grade also coming in below the projections, while 4th grade was on par and 5th grade was 7 students above the projection.
- Enrollment at Branchville as above the projections +14 students while Ridgebury was equal to the projections.
- Enrollment at Barlow Mountain (-14), Farmingville (-15), Scotland (-6), and Veterans Park (-11) were below the medium projections.







Ridgefield's Total Population

- According to the 2020 US Census, Ridgefield's population is now 25,030, a growth of 1.6% or approx. 400 people over the last decade.
- 2023 population estimates from the CT Department of Public Health estimate 24,931 residents, which is less than 0.5% decline.
- Median age increased from 41.8 to 45.7 from 2010-2020 driven by growth in cohorts age 55 years old and over.

Ridgefield Estimated Population Change 2010-2020










Birth Trends and Projections

- Beginning in 2019, births transitioned from calendar year to September-August to align with new CT entry age requirements (this year's Kindergarten cohort).
- Over the last 4-years, births have seen an uptick, averaging 189 births.
- Birth projection models using a combination of demographic and mathematical modeling.
 - Low model averages 179
 - Medium model averages 186
 - High model averages 194
- All three models are in alignment with recent trend.








- Very strong home sales in 2020 and 2021 – highest levels since early 2000s
- For 2022, sales returned to prepandemic levels at just over 400.
- 2023 saw total sales dip below 300, 2024 YTD is on a similar pace and total sales are estimated at 291.
- Low inventory, high prices, and little new single-family construction are all contributing factors to current housing market conditions.










Median Sale Price SF Homes

Ridgefield Median Sale Price Single Family Homes (2000-2024 YTD)




- The Median Sale Price for Single-Family homes has increased 62% since 2019, with median single family home price for 2024 YTD at just over \$1 million.
- Median Sale Price for condos has experienced even greater growth at 76% since 2019; 2024 YTD at \$400,000





Housing Permit Activity

- Strong multi-family development between 2012 and 2019 – primarily in Ridgefield Center.
- Single-family development averaging ~15 per year over the last ten years
- According to Ridgefield's Planning Dept., A 91-unit Townhouse and Apartment development on Ethan Allen Highway (1- and 2-bedroom units) was recently approved by Planning and Zoning. However, after an inland wetland's denial, the project is currently under appeal.

Town of Ridgefield Planning Department, September 2024

- Two developments, 901 Ethan Allen Hwy and 27 Abbott Ave are appealing denials by the Ridgefield's inland wetlands commission.
- Four additional developments, totaling 48 units, are approved, under construction, or recently built with a majority of the units either 1BR or 2BR units.
- Additionally, the town has planning efforts around the Branchville Station, including a recent strategic planning building off
 the 2017 TOD Plan, which calls for nearly 200 apartments and 200 townhouses as part of the envisioned redevelopment.
 Unlike the projects shown in table above, which are imminent, the Branchville development projects are still planning
 initiatives at this point.








Enrollment Trends & Projections



Net Migration








- Elementary net migration averaged +61 students over the last five years years, however, after a peak in 2021-22 at 121, net migration has seen a decline, averaging just 45 students over the last 2 years.
- Middle school net migration varies from year-to-year with a net in-migration of +13 students over the last 5-years. After a low of just +1 student in 2023-24, 2024-25 saw net in-migration increase to +24 students.
- High School has historically experienced net out-migration. However, over the last 5-years, the high school has seen a net in-migration of +17 students. This is in part due to the inclusion of Ridgefield Transition Program and outplaced students in the high school enrollment.


- The total number of "New to District (NTD)" students was identified by comparing unique student identifiers (SASID's) that were not enrolled the previous year (excludes PK & K). This includes students that are attributed to home sales.
- Overall, NTD students were down for the last 2-years at 163 & 190, respectively, lagging below pre-pandemic levels. Over the
 last 5-years, NTD student trends mirrored trends in housing sales.
- For Grades 1-5, there were a total of just 93 NTD students, which is the second in recent history behind 2023-24, with lower elementary grades lagging the greatest behind historic average.



Student Migration

- Over the last 2-years, lower housing turnover and student in-migration is evident with all elementary schools trending below the historic average.
- Over the last 5-years, all schools average between 20-27 students annually. However, there is significant year-to-year variation.






Student Migration

- After elevated NTD middle school students in 2021-22 and 2022-23, the last two years averaged just 44 NTD students.
- Historically, East Ridge and Scotts Ridge NTD students are nearly split evenly and this trend continued in 2024-25.

New-to-District Students (Grades 6-8)





New-to-District Students

- In total, there were 190 new-to-district students between grades 1-12 in 2024-25.
- New-to-District students most concentrated in higher density neighborhoods surrounding Downtown Ridgefield. However, there are scattered smaller clusters in the residential neighborhoods through the Town.
- For 2024-25, NTD students were lower overall for this year and more evenly distributed between the elementary schools.




- <u>210 home sales</u> between Jan 1st through September 30th 2024, yielded <u>63 new students</u> for 2024-25, which is up slightly from 2023-24.
- 0.30 students per housing sale in 2024
 - Higher than 2023 but remains lower than 2022 (0.35) and 2021 (0.37) and long-term average of (0.4).
- 43 sales (20%) yielded students who enrolled in RPS. Of these:
 - 2 sales = 3 students per sale
 - 16 sales = 2 students per sale
 - 25 sales = 1 student per sale
- 42 of 63 students generated from home sales (67%) are elementary students
- Greater share of students not matched to home sales indicates that rentals (both condos and single-family homes) drove in-migration in 2024-25.

- Total home sales on par with 2023 levels, which is much lower than peak levels seen in 2020 and 2021. However, student generation and student generation per sale are up slightly from last year.
- Branchville (BES 8 students) and Farmingville (FES 12 students) have the highest number of students generated from home sales while the highest student generation rates are at FES (0.32) and Ridgebury (RES 0.26).
- Barlow Mountain (BMES 5 students), Veterans Park (VPES 5 students), Scotland (SES 6 students), and Ridgebury (RES 6 students) saw the fewest number of students generated from sales.
- BMES (0.12) and VPES (0.13) had the lowest student generation rate per sale.






Districtwide Historic Enrollment Trends

- Over the last 5-years, K-12 enrollment was fairly stable averaging 4,479 students, however, different trends have been experienced at elementary, middle and high school grade groupings
- Over the last 5-years:
 - Elementary enrollment increased by 10 students (~1%)
 - Middle school enrollment declined by 71 students (-7%)
 - High School enrollment declined by 172 students (-11%)
- Over the last year, PK enrollment increased from 55 to 79 students.



- While overall elementary has been stable over the last 5-years, trends vary by elementary school.
- Over the last 5-years, Barlow Mountain and Farmingville increased by 11.5% and nearly 16%, respectively.
- Branchville & Ridgebury saw enrollment decline by less than 5%.
- Scotland & Veterans Park had more moderate declines at -5% and -10%, respectively.







- Middle School feeder re-alignment in 2016 is evident in the 10-year enrollment trends.
- Over the last 5-years, East Ridge has declined by nearly 12%, averaging 502 students.
- Scott's Ridge has declined by less than 1%, averaging
 538 students over the last 5-years.





Projections Primer

- Based on Cohort Survival Methodology Standard method accepted by OGA (formerly OSCG&R) for school construction projects
- The cohort survival methodology <u>relies on observed data from the recent past in order to project the</u> near future
- Persistency Ratios calculated from historic enrollment data to determine growth or loss in a class as it progresses through the school system
- Persistency Ratio of 1.0 means cohort size remains the same; 1.05 means the cohort size increases by 5%, or a cohort of 100 grows to 105 the following year
- Persistency Ratios account for the various external factors affecting enrollments: housing characteristics, residential development, economic conditions, student transfers in and out of system, and student mobility
- Changes in population, housing stock and tenure, and economic conditions help explain persistency ratios
- Changes in programming affect persistency ratios of individual schools
- Recent changes to Kindergarten entry age adds uncertainty to Kindergarten enrollment until trends are established.





Projections Assumptions

These projections are predicated on the following assumptions:

- Pre-K enrollment will increase and average 100 students per year
- Housing, student generation, and future birth assumptions at the districtwide level will prove accurate
- **High projections:** Assume high birth projections (average 194 annually) and student in-migration averages 2.3% for the next 10-years, which is above the 10-year average (1.8%)
- Medium projections: Assume medium birth projections (average 186 annually) and student in-migration averages 2.0% for the next 10-years, slightly above the 10-yr average
- Low projections: Assume low birth projections (average 179 annually) student in-migration averages 1.6% for the next 10-years, which is below the 10-year average.
- There won't be changes to the elementary attendance zones, nor the middle school feeder pattern over the next decade.
- High School projections adjusted to account for Ridgefield Transition Program (RTP) and Ridgefield outplaced students separately. High School includes Ridgefield Transition Program, which is anticipated to increase up to 28 students next year, and up to 40 students annually thereafter.
- Outplaced student trends will continue for elementary and middle schools at roughly 16 students annually, however, there are grade to grade variations annually.



- With the change in Kindergarten entry age for 2024-25, Birth-K dropped. It is anticipated that this is a one-time reduction, since only 8-months of births contributed to this year's K cohort.

Birth-K Analysis


- Growing Birth-K ratio since 2014-15 school year indicates that inmigration is increasingly driving kindergarten enrollments
- Static estimate of Birth-K ratio likely to be misleading due to year-to-year fluctuations in births, housing conditions, and inmigration
- Over the last 10-years, 42% of K cohort is from in-migration.
- Birth-K for 2024-25, was a recent low of 1.53 due to the new Kindergarten entry date coming into effect this year.





District Projections

- In first 5-years, all three models show a range of 230 K-12 students (4,305-4,535), which increases in the last 5-years, ranging from approx. 4,176 to 4,646 students by 2034-35.
- Housing conditions, demographics and enrollment in-migration align best with Medium Model and represents the most likely direction.
- Under the medium model, K-12th enrollment is projected to be flat with an average of 4,411 students over the next decade.
- Recent changes to the housing market conditions bear watching (rising median sale price, stagnant home sales), as this will annually impact student in-migration, both districtwide and localized.








District Projections (Medium)

- K-5 enrollments are projected to increase modestly by 2.4% and average 1,916 students over the next 10-yrs
- Middle school enrollments will at 2.4% also, averaging 1,055 over next decade.
- High school is projected to average 1,440 students over the next decade. High School includes Ridgefield Transition Program, which is anticipated to grow 28 students next year, and up to 40 students annually thereafter.







District Projections (Medium)

- Elementary School enrollment is project to increase by 1.6% over the first 5-years, and 0.8% over the last 5-yr of projection horizon
- Over the next 5-years, Middle School is projected to decline by -1.5% then increase by nearly 4% over the last 5-years.
- High school is projected to decline by -1% over the first 5years and -4% over the last 5years.
